Companies that produce and process chicken are an integral part of Georgia's economy. Producers and processors of chicken, along with the companies that provide supplies and materials to the industry, provide well-paying jobs in the state and pay significant amounts in taxes to state and federal governments.

The Chicken Industry is an Integral Part of the Economy in Georgia

- ❖ Companies that produce and process chicken in Georgia employ as many as 37,928 people across the state and generate an additional 94,554 jobs in supplier and ancillary industries. These include jobs in companies supplying goods and services to the industry.
- ❖ These are good jobs paying an average of \$62,000 in wages and benefits. And in today's economy, every job is important. In fact, in Georgia the unemployment rate has reached 3.6 percent. This means that there are 192,600 people trying to find jobs across the state.

The Economic Benefits of the Industry Spread Throughout the State

- ❖ Not only does the chicken industry create good jobs in Georgia but the industry also contributes to the economy as a whole. The broader economic impact flows throughout the economy, generating business for firms seemingly unrelated to the chicken industry. Real people, with real jobs, working in industries as varied as banking, real estate, accounting, even printing all depend on the chicken industry for their livelihood.
- ❖ In fact, in 2024, the industry was responsible for as much as \$41.56 billion in total economic activity throughout the state, creating or supporting as many as 132,482 total jobs.
- ❖ Not only does the chicken industry create jobs, it also generates sizeable tax revenues. In Georgia, the industry and its employees pay about \$2.66 billion in federal taxes and \$1.69 billion in state and local taxes.
